✓ Complete the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC)

The B.A. degree at CSS includes general education requirements referred to as Veritas. The College of St. Scholastica accepts the MnTC or AA degree (with MnTC) to fulfill all of the Veritas requirements except for one religious studies course and one upper division Integrations course. The Integrations requirement must be completed at CSS.

Students who have not completed the MnTC are encouraged to contact a CSS admissions counselor to discuss the best option for fulfilling the Veritas requirements. General education information is also available on the Transferology website.
