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Alliss Grant Terms and Conditions

- You must be a Minnesota resident.
- You must be admitted to the college (submit an NHCC application to the Admissions Office).
- You must not have attended high school during the past seven years.
- You must be a first time college student or not attended an educational institution during the past seven years.
- You cannot have a four-year college degree.
- The Alliss grant is a one-term award that will pay for tuition and books for one class (up to five credits). You are responsible for all course fees.
- The course selected must be a transferable course that would be accepted as an integral academic part of an A.A., A.S., or A.A.S degree program or a developmental-level course if it is required for the student to start a degree program. Certificate and diploma programs are ineligible as are on-the-job customized training courses. A counselor can help you select an appropriate course (Counseling Office: 424-0703).
- Alliss grants are not based on family income.
- If you receive additional grants, scholarships or tuition reimbursement, the Alliss grant may be reduced.

Alliss Grant Application Instructions

- DO NOT register for your class prior to receiving approval for the Alliss grant from the Financial Aid Office. The Alliss grant will not reimburse a student if they register and pay for the class prior to being approved.
- You will be notified by mail if your application is approved or denied. If approved, you can register for your class.
- Go to the Accounting and Fees Office with your Alliss grant award letter after you register. The Accounting and Fees Office will assess your fees cost and provide you with a voucher to use for your required textbook(s).
