Responsibilities:

- Primary teaching responsibilities include theory instruction and lab/clinical supervision.

- Flexible to teach day, evening or weekend sections.

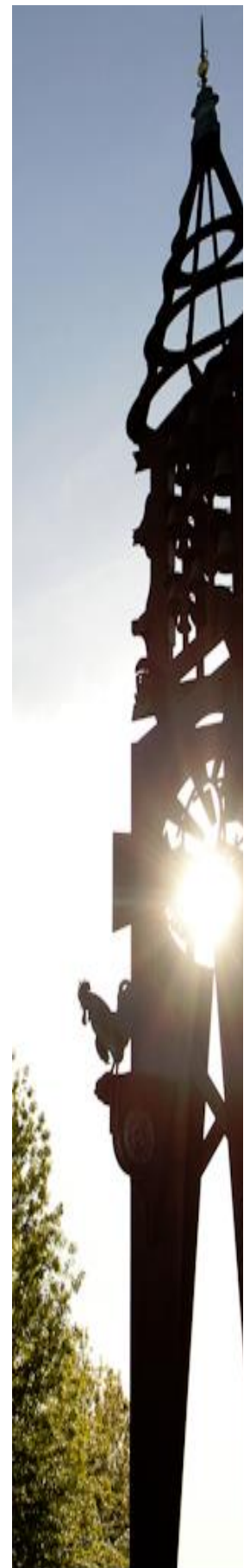
Minimum Qualifications:

Education Requirement

- Master's degree with a major in nursing, nursing administration, nursing education, public health nursing, or a nursing clinical specialty.

Occupational Experience Requirement

- Two full-time years (or equivalent) of verified related paid work experience as a registered nurse at the professional level.



Recency Requirement

- One year of this work experience shall be within the five years immediately preceding the date of application for the credential field. The recency requirement shall be waived if the individual has two years of successful full-time (or equivalent) postsecondary teaching experience in the credential field within the last five years.

Professional Requirement

- Current Minnesota Registered Nurse (RN) license.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Current theory instruction and clinical experience in medical surgical desired. Experience in online teaching or demonstrated willingness to learn and develop online courses.
- Experience with learner outcomes assessment.
- Demonstrated ability to educate adult learners, students of color, students with disabilities, and international students.
- Working knowledge of alternative instructional techniques and delivery methods such as online education, podcasting, digital technology, etc.
- Proficient in Microsoft Office applications (Word, Excel, PowerPoint).
- The ability to learn new and adapt to changing technology in nursing education and nursing practice. Examples: Electronic health record, classroom technology such as interactive clickers, online testing software, and clinical simulation technology such as simulation manikins and their accompanying software.
