**Note:** Metropolitan State will accept 12 lower-division credits in transfer toward the English BA. ENGL 2550 or 2560 and ENGL 2450 or 2460 (6 credits) along with two other elective courses (6 credits) are recommended for transfer to the English BA. All other credits will apply to the BA degree, leaving 24 credits to complete the English major at Metropolitan State.



## Articulation (Transfer) Agreement

There is an articulation agreement between North Hennepin Community College and Metropolitan State University for this program. The agreement is in effect from July 1, 2015 through July 1, 2020 unless terminated or amended by either institution.

- To receive the most benefit from this agreement, notify your Metropolitan State academic advisor that you are transferring to the university under this agreement.
- If an agreement has been terminated or amended, you will be allowed to complete your degree using the agreement that was in effect at the time you made a commitment to the program.

## Metropolitan State University Graduation Requirements:

- All courses for the major completed with a C- or higher grade or S (Satisfactory).
- A minimum of 120 total acceptable, unduplicated credits.
- A minimum of 40 upper-division credits.
- A minimum of 30 credits completed at Metropolitan State University.
- Credits completed must be distributed to meet the applicable major and program requirements as well as General Education and Liberal Studies (GELS) requirements.
- Credits completed must include the Racial Issues Graduation Requirement. Note: This requirement applies to all new undergraduate students admitted Fall 2016 or later.
- A minimum GPA (Grade Point Average) of 2.0.

- Program requirements are described in the college and school sections of the catalog and in departmental program materials.

## Notes

1. This guide is NOT a contract unless it is based on an articulation agreement. Program requirements are subject to change without notice. Requirements for the degree are “locked in” at the time the program declaration is approved by the college.
2. This guide is for planning purposes only. It shows one way to complete your baccalaureate degree in 120 credits. Students should develop an educational plan in consultation with an academic advisor prior to, and during, enrollment at North Hennepin Community College to assure that degree requirements (general education, prerequisites, and major requirements) are fulfilled and to get assistance and information about transfer credit evaluation.
3. You are strongly encouraged to meet with an academic advisor to discuss the following:

  - MnTC completion
  - Liberal Studies and Racial Issues Graduation Requirements
  - Major declaration process
  - Residence requirements
  - Graduation requirements
  - 40 upper-division credits requirement
4. If a North Hennepin Community College course is shown as equivalent to an upper-division course at Metropolitan State University, the North Hennepin course credits will transfer to Metropolitan State as lower division. This may have an impact on the 40 upper-division credits requirement for graduation.
